

## GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. Entries are free and open to all financial members of societies affiliated with the Sub-Tropical Orchid Council of Queensland.
2. No plant may be removed from the show until the official termination of the show without special permission of the Show Committee.
3. Plants not in show bench condition, diseased or pest infected are not eligible.
4. ALL plants are to be clearly labelled (Owners name on back of label).
5. The only flowering plants, other than orchids, permitted in the display are Anthuriums and Bromeliads. Bromeliads and Anthuriums are not eligible as foliage plants.
6. All plants exhibited must be the property of the exhibitor, and are displayed at the owner's risk.
7. Each Society or Group exhibit must have a steward present by the exhibit during all judging.
8. A flower or flowers missing from an inflorescence will disqualify only that inflorescence unless the missing flower or flowers are tabled, on the pot with the plant. Plants, which flower progressively, may have flowers missing.
9. A pollinated, dead or dying flower or flowers on a plant or inflorescence shall not disqualify that plant or inflorescence but shall detract from the merit of the exhibit.
10. A minimum of 50% of buds on an inflorescence must be fully opened before it is eligible to be judged.
11. Any prize need not be awarded when the judges consider the standard too low to warrant such a prize, or if there are insufficient entries at the discretion of the show steward. The Judges' decision is final.
12. A specimen plant shall mean a mature plant, which has been developed from a single undivided clone.
13. Plants may be exhibited benched or in displays.
14. Tying and staking of inflorescences for support is permitted but the ties may be removed to allow the judges to ascertain the strength of the inflorescence.

## SCHEDULE DEFINITIONS

1. In the cattleya classes, "cattleya" is to include intra and intergeneric hybrids of one or more of the cattleya alliance genera. (Cattleya, Brassavola, Laelia, Sophronitis, Broughtonia, diacrum, and or Epidendrum)
2. Cluster cattleya is to have a minimum of five (5) flowers on the inflorescence. Class 16 to be any colour
3. Dendrobium-Phalaenanthe is to include all dendrobiums regardless of breeding which have their petals generally rounded.
4. Dendrobium - "intermediate towards Spatulata" are those showing Spatulata influences.
5. Dendrobium - "intermediate towards Phalaenanthe" are those with spaced segments but no twists.
6. Oncidium allied Genera should include Miltonia, Brassia, Odontoglossum, Cochlioda and hybrids of them.
7. Vanda Alliance to include Aerides, Renanthera, Rhynchostylis, Phalaenopsis and hybrids including these.
8. Plants should be placed on the Champion judging table at the discretion of the Judges of each section.
9. Paphiopedilums to include Phragmapediums.
10. Pansy Dendrobiums to be judged in Phalaenanthe classes.
